5. On July 27, 2018, nearly a dozen participants at the field and headquarters levels of DOE and DECLARATION OF WILLIAM HARRIS WALKER IN SUPPORT OF UNITED STATES' RESPONSE TO PLAINTIFF'S MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION – Page 1

NNSA met with Brad Crowell, Governor Brian Sandoval's Policy Director Pam Robinson, and 1 2 Director of the Nevada Department of Environmental Protection Greg Lovato and Chris Andres also from the Nevada Department of Environmental Protection in a daylong meeting. The 3 meeting discussed the Department's enduring mission at NNSS, including a discussion of the 4 potential staging at the NNSS of the one metric ton of plutonium to be moved from the Savanah 5 6 River Site. NNSA thoroughly briefed the State on the proposed plan and the possibility of 7 NNSS being chosen to receive some or all of the one metric ton of plutonium. In addition, 8 NNSA also explained how the staging of the material at the NNSS's Device Assembly Facility 9 ("DAF") would not change the normal operations of the site and explained the extensive safety and security measures in place at the DAF to protect the material. 10 12 6. On August 27, 2018, I informed Brad Crowell by electronic mail that NNSA had completed

its SA and determined that the new scope of work had no significant environmental impacts which would justify creating a new EIS and that NNSS continued to be a possible location for the staging of some or all of the plutonium to be moved from the Savanah River Site.

7. On August 29, 2018, I met with Brad Crowell via phone, explained the findings in the SA, and informed him of NNSA's intent to publish the document on August 30, 2018. The SA was published to the public on August 30, 2018, as planned.

8. After reviewing the SA, the State of Nevada requested a phone call on September 14, 2018, to discuss the issue further. The request was granted and a conference call that included the Deputy Chief of Staff to Secretary Perry, Dan Wilmot, and NNSA General Counsel Bruce Diamond, and State Officials was conducted further discussing the issue and the State's objections. This call resulted in a follow up meeting of the Nevada Working Group on October 30, 2018. During the meeting, the Department further detailed its plans for shipping plutonium to the State, and extensive discussions were had pertaining to the methods and procedures for shipping the material – including a presentation of a 3013 shipping container insert for reference.

9. During all discussions listed above, the State expressed extensive public perception concerns with planned activities. The State also made claims that there was a substantive difference between the existing mission use of plutonium at the site and the temporary staging of material to be used at other sites and this made the previous NEPA analysis inadequate. At no time, however, did the State express grave concerns for the health and safety of the citizens of Nevada and explained that they understood the safety and security with which we transport nuclear materials, particularly when done so by the Office of Secure Transportation, as would be the case here. The State's primary concern throughout the process, as state both verbally and in correspondence, has been a public perception concern and the fact that the Department was not providing any sort of compensation or new missions to the State in exchange for being willing to temporarily stage the material.

10. During our discussions, I also explained to the State that any plutonium transport would occur in conformance with all existing federal laws and regulations, including all safety requirements for "Type B Packaging" required for the transport of fissile materials.
